
Build a Beacon of Christ! Adult Christian Formation

Drivers Needed for Meals on Wheels

Meals on Wheels Spokane has been delivering hot nutritious meals to elderly, disabled and homebound seniors in Spokane since 1967, providing proper nutrition to individuals who cannot meet this need on their own. With the help of 400+ volunteers, MOW serves over 330 meals daily and more than 110,000 meals each year.

St. John's participates in the MOW program with both volunteer drivers and annual cash grants. At

present, our drivers deliver meals every five weeks, Mondays through Thursdays, 10:30am-12:30pm, on five different routes. This effort requires twenty drivers to complete each five-week rotation.

Several long-time drivers have retired from the St. John's Meals on Wheels volunteer team. If we wish to continue our involvement in this program, we need to recruit a number of new drivers dur-

ing the next few months.

From the Dean

Hello to all of St. John’s Cathedral, both in the Spokane area and friends from further away! I am honored to have been called to serve as Dean of the Cathedral and I look forward to getting to know you across this next year. Thank you for the warm welcome that you have provided my family as well. We truly feel welcomed—in the deanery, on Sunday morning in worship and at coffee hour, and into the Spokane community.

The poem excerpted above comes from a contemporary Irish poet who is steeped in Celtic Christianity. O’Donohue died unexpectedly in 2008 but his explorations of the spiritual life lived out in the everyday world contin-

ue to spread God’s blessings. These verses shared above speak to me of the journey that I have been on, as well as the journey of search and new beginning that the Cathedral has had. In the past program year, each of us has had that spark and kindling that it was time for something new. Guided by the Holy Spirit and grounded in prayer, that unclear destination—for me, a new call somewhere new, and for the Cathedral, a new dean to lead and serve with you—came slowly into focus. This time of new start and new beginnings continues as we get to know each other. So, please, keep your spirit of adventure handy, knowing that we rest in God’s hands and are buoyed by God’s grace. Know that I am praying for you and I ask you to pray for me.

You might be wondering what I have been doing since my first official day in the office on August 15. I have put a time priority on meeting with people—getting to know the staff, meeting one on one with parishioners, and attending some committee meetings. I am getting to know how St. John’s works, learning and reviewing management structures for committees and staff. I am also assessing what is needed as I prepare to search for a new associate priest. I must add that I am thankful for the staff at St. John’s and for their work especially during the transition period. Whether you are a person who drops by the office, calls in, or sends an email, please thank Joan, Rosie, Richie, and Mbale for their work in support of the Cathedral’s ministries. Looking ahead, I am excited to meet many more of you and to get to know you, whether at coffee hour, in a committee, or at a one on one meeting. I am a people person; I love getting to know

others and to hear their stories and faith journeys. I am also excited to get to know the Cathedral’s neighbors in the South Hill community, as well as the greater Spokane (city and valley) community. This goes for our Episcopal brothers and sisters, ministries that we support, and the community in general. Starting in mid-September, I will take a few hours outside of the office each week to connect with the community and learn the ways in which people in Spokane seek God and the Divine. In these various connections, I hope that we can begin to shape how St. John’s Cathedral will grow—deepening in spirituality and prayer life, broadening in fellowship with each other and service to those in need, strengthening in fiscal health (to the glory of God) and in welcome to visitors and newcomers seeking a church home. Through our work together, we will seek how the Cathedral can more fully be our corner of the Episcopal branch of the Jesus Movement.

Update on Staffing Transitions

As many of you know, our curate, the Rev. Nic Mather, left St. John's in August 2018 to serve as rector of St. Stephen's, Longview, WA. At the same time our children and youth minister, Lucas Kulhanek-Arenas, moved to Austin, Texas, to begin studies at Seminary of the Southwest as a postulant of the Diocese of Spokane. This is an exciting time for both of them and their families, as well as a time of good news for the church as their ministry and calls grow. This also means that St. John's has some more transitions to come. (Keep that spirit of adventure, right!)

I am grateful that the Rev. Canon Kristi Philip has agreed to stay at the Cathedral as Canon Associate, part-time, for a few months while we seek a new assistant priest. She will have oversight with faith formation ministries, newcomers, and pastoral care. I am delighted to have a partner in ministry at the Cathedral in her.

Our music director, Dr. Timothy Westerhaus, is also full-time on faculty at Gonzaga University. Over the summer, Tim discerned

that he needed to decrease his time at the Cathedral in order to fulfill his multiple work and ministry commitments. In working with Canon Philip and with my approval, we have decided that Tamara Schupman is the right person to be the assistant music director for the Cathedral. Tim will continue to lead the music ministry and Tamara will gain additional responsibilities for directing and rehearsing the adult choir. Tamara will continue to lead and rehearse the Junior Choir.

Lastly, I am thankful for a variety of volunteers who have stepped up to lead Sunday school across this program year while we reassess the Cathedral's children and youth ministries and director position. I am also thankful that Malloory Davis, who is known to our high school youth, will be leading the high school youth group for the fall, meeting on Sundays at 6pm, starting on September 16. Middle school youth are welcome to attend the youth group she leads at St. Stephen's, Sundays at noon. And we welcome Susan Dordal as the interim nursery director while Molly Haffner is on maternity leave.

Please hold the program staff and these volunteers in your prayers and thank them for sharing of their gifts, talents, and skills with the Cathedral community.

Heart and Hands

Gretchen Ramey convened a meeting of leaders of many Outreach activities on July 29, gaining insight for Chapter on the successes to celebrate and the opportunities for service available through the Cathedral. With our Ministry Fair just ahead, I encourage you to think about what you are called to do; in a paraphrase of President Kennedy's words, Ask not what your church can do for you, ask what you can do for your church. The ministries of church are worth your time. Shared ministry lets you get to know your fellow parishioners so many of whom have fascinating stories to tell. I'd never got past hello with Clarissa Ramey until we answered KSPS phones on behalf of St John's last week, and now I know I'd like to know her better. Ministry is how we practice living our faith, preparing us for living our faith outside of the Cathedral. Outreach is the subset of ministry that gets us out of our comfort zone and broadens our understanding of the love of God for all persons and all of creation. Like prayer, fellowship, and the reading of Scripture, Outreach is the stuff we need to build personal faith and build our faith community.

We've had great successes and we have some near-term opportunities in Outreach. I learned Stan Fergin, once St. John's Senior Warden, was recently recognized for 50 years of service to Meals on Wheels. Stan was among the founders of the program and held the wheel for half a century. What a testament to loving your neighbor as yourself! Dawn Worrall was at the Outreach meeting and described the upcoming

Centennial celebration of the Hutton Settlement, an organization that has had Board members from St John's since its inception (not surprisingly, its buildings were designed by Harold Whitehouse, who designed St. John's). Executive Director Chud Wendle has offered tours for Cathedral parishioners on **September 13**, and we looking to set a second date the following week. New Payment Options

The Finance Office is pleased to announce that the Cathedral has two new ways to donate to the Cathedral! Currently you can pay with:

- Cash
- Check
- Electronic funds transfer from your bank ***This is the preferred way to pay your pledge as there are no fees.
- Credit card payment

To keep up with payment trends, we now have a "Square" that is used with an iPad and Text Message.

We anticipate the Square/iPad could be used for fundraisers and music events. If your group would like to use the Square, contact Rosie to obtain it. The instructions are in the kit. At your event, you simply swipe the credit card and enter the amount. When your event is complete, you advise Rosie the amount you have earned.

Secondly we can accept payments via Text Message. The company we are using is **Tithe.ly**, which is an app developed specifically for churches. The first time you use it requires some set up.

Text GIVE to **425-441-3395**

After your first transaction, we recommend you download the app and use the app for future donations. (If not, subsequent donations are tricky to allocate.). We hope that you consider using this method for Sunday plate contributions.

Both the new payment types as well as credit card payments *incur transaction fees*. With Tithe.ly, please consider including the transaction fee with your payment.

From the Canon Associate

I have a few new tasks during this next phase in our transition in leadership as our new dean, Heather VanDeventer and her family get acquainted with their new parish, new city and new diocese.

One of my favorites is writing notes to people who have visited our Sunday worship services and who fill out what we call “newcomer cards.” These are simply cards that offer visitors an opportunity to have some kind of follow-up from their contact with us.

I like to do this for several reasons. One is that I really like to write letters. But that is not the main one. The important reason for doing this is to somehow expand the embrace of our community—to begin a process of connecting with individuals or families who have chosen to worship with us.

I don’t expect that everyone who comes here on a Sunday will choose to become permanent members of our congregation. That’s not the point. But I do hope that everyone who comes through our doors will feel a sense of hospitality. A sense that they are truly welcomed and valued by all of us.

That’s a ministry we are all invited to share, whether it be by helping someone find the nursery, sitting with visitors, striking up a conversation at coffee hour, introducing newcomers to others, offering a special welcome to children or any number of other ways we can be good hosts.

I really liked what Scott Gunn of Forward Movement had to say about the importance of this ministry we all share: “There’s another important part of welcoming guests: our spirit. If our goal when a guest arrives is to persuade them to join our church, we are setting aside Christian hospitality in favor of being salespeople. Our task, when a guest shows up, is not to think of them as prospective members. Our task is to bless our guests.”

That, he says, is simply hospitali-

ty for the sake of hospitality. Welcoming strangers with the love of God that we are invited to share.

One of my favorite hospitality stories—one I love to share—comes from an experience at London’s Church of St. Martin in the Fields where I was a visitor a few years ago. The service was lovely, the sermon engaging and then, during the prayers there was a loud outburst from someone near the front of the church. It got louder and louder and, finally, a man, bed-roll under his arm, stomped up the aisle and out of the church—still in a loud conversation with someone that no one else could see.

It was an awkward moment for sure. But the officiating priest put it into context as he spoke to us during the Peace. The man, he said, was a client of the church’s homeless shelter and had spent the night off the streets and in a safe place. “It is our privilege,” he said, “that he chose to worship with us today.”

May we be blessed with the grace to offer hospitality in ways that bless all of our guests.
